Your Directors take pleasure in presenting the **4**th **Annual Report** of your company, together with the Audited Financial Statements for the year ended March 31, 2022.

During the year under review, your Company earned aggregate revenue of Rs.1, 00,374.78 Lakhs as against Rs.42, 171.95 Lakhs during the previous year, which comprised of sale of sugar & other sales of Rs.97,859.02 Lakhs, commission income of

Rs.1,868.24 Lakhs and other income of Rs.645.52 Lakhs. Profit after tax of the Company stand at Rs.1,527.07 Lakhs as compared to Rs.760.52 Lakhs during the previous year.

2. REVIEW OF OPERATIONS:

Your Company is committed to make Meir a global leader in the commodity space over a period and it continued to work in that direction. It has commenced exports of sugar to Afghanistan, Dubai, UK, Singapore, Hong Kong and other destinations across the Globe.

It has Laos enlarged its domestic reach and tried to combine trade with sound advice. Most of the customers have been retained. The representation and research activities has been enlarged.

3. **DIVIDEND**:

Your Directors have deemed it prudent not to recommend any dividend on equity shares for the year in order to conserve the resources for the future years.

4. <u>RESERVES:</u>

The Company proposed to transfer the amount of Rs. 200 Lakhs to the General Reserves.

5. CHANGE IN THE NATURE OF BUSINESS:

There has been no change in the nature of the business of the Company.

6. DISCLOSURES UNDER SECTION 134(3)(1) OF THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013:

Except as disclosed elsewhere in this report, no material changes and commitments which could affect the Company's financial position have occurred between the end of the financial year of the Company and date of this report.

7. REVISION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

There was no revision of the financial statements for the year under review.

8. DEPOSITS:

Your Company has neither accepted nor renewed any deposits within the meaning of section 73 of Companies Act, 2013, read with the Companies (Acceptance of Deposit) Rules, 2014.

9. SHARE CAPITAL:

During the year under review, there has been a change in the capital structure of your company. The Authorised Share Capital of the company has been enhanced to Rs.1000 Wakhs divided into 100 Lakh Equity Shares of Rs.10 each from the pre enhanced levels of Rs 100 Lakhs divided into 10 Lakh shares. It has been done to accommodate capital

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expansion plans including issuance of Bonus shares. The Issued, Subscribed and Paidup Share Capital of the Company stand at Rs.8,00,00,000 divided into 80,00,000 Equity Shares of Rs.10 each.

During the year under review, the Company has not issued shares with differential voting rights nor granted stock options nor sweat equity.

During the year under review, the Company has issued bonus shares to its existing shareholders amounting to Rs. 799 Lakhs divided into 7990 Lakhs number of Bonus Shares in the ratio of 799:1

As on March 31, 2022, all the shares of the Company are held by the existing shareholders/ directors of the company.

10. HOLDING AND SUBSIDIARY COMPANY:

Presently, the Company does not have any holding, subsidiary or associate company. No Company has ceased to be the Company's Subsidiary, Joint Venture or Associate during FY 2021-22.

11. BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND KEY MANAGERIAL PERSONNEL:

A. COMPOSITION & CONSTITUTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

During the year under review, following change has occurred as two independent directors were added to the Board as a part of improving Board efficiency and Corporate Governance.

- a. Mr. Sanjay Tapriya was admitted to the board of Directors of the Company on 06th August 2021 as Additional director under the category of Independent Director (DIN: 00064703)
- b. Mr. Gopal Krishna Sood was admitted to the board of Directors of the company on 23rd March 2022 as Additional director under the category of Independent Director (DIN: 00106839)

The regular appointment of these directors is proposed in the ensuing annual general meeting. None of them are holding any share in the company.

The Company has laid down a well-defined risk management mechanism to mitigate the risks and has adopted a policy in this regard in line with the requirement of the Companies Act, 2013. The said policy inter-alia covers identification and access to the key risks areas and monitors the areas in order to take corrective measure at appropriate time. The overall objective of the policy is to improve awareness of the Company's risk exposure and appropriately manage it.

13. STATUTORY AUDITORS AND AUDITORS' REPORT:

Members at the 4th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Company held on 29.09.2022, has appointed M/s. Katwala & Co LLP., Chartered Accountants, Mumbai, (ICAI Firm Registration No.W100749), as the Company's Statutory Auditors to hold Office from the conclusion of the 4th AGM until the conclusion of the 8th AGM. In this regard, M/s. Katwala & Co LLP., Chartered Accountants, have confirmed their eligibility under Section 139(1) & 141 of the Companies Act, 2013.

The Auditors' Report to the shareholders for the year under review, does not contain any qualification, reservation, adverse remark or disclaimer.

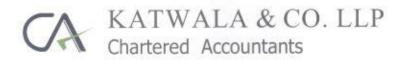

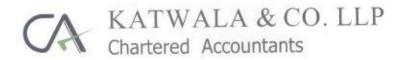

Note 1 Corporate Information

Note	Particulars
	Corporate information
	The name of the company is Meir Commodities India Private Limited. Registered Office of the company is situated in the state of Maharashtra i.e within the jurisdiction of Registrar of Companies, Maharashtra at Thane. Meir Commodities India Private Limited is in the business of Buying, Selling, Reselling, Importing, Exporting, Storing, Marketing and Trading in agriculture goods, molasses and ethanol within and outside India.

Note 2 Significant accounting policies

2 Significant accounting policies (Illustrative)

2.1 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

2.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

2.3 Inventories

The inventories consists of closing stock of Sugar, Chawali, Chilli Powder, Garam Masala and Iodised salt and Stock of the same is maintained in the books of accounts.

2.4 Cash and cash equivalents (for purposes of Cash Flow Statement)

Cash comprises cash on hand, Petty Cash and demand deposits with banks.

2.5 Cash flow statement

Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

2.6 Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation has been provided of Rs. 10.64/-(Rs. in Lakhs) (Previous Year Rs.4.85) as per the rates prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 during the year ended 31st March, 2022. Assets costing less than Rs. 5,000 each are fully depreciated in the year of capitalisation.

2.7 Revenue recognition

Sale of goods

Sales are recognised, net of returns and trade discounts, on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer, which generally coincides with the delivery of goods to customers. Sales include excise duty but exclude sales tax, goods and service tax and value added tax.

2.8 Other Income

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis. Dividend income, if any is accounted for when the right to receive it is established.







2.9 Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of fixed assets includes interest on borrowings attributable to acquisition of qualifying fixed assets up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use and other incidental expenses incurred up to that date. Exchange differences arising on restatement / settlement of long-term foreign currency borrowings relating to acquisition of depreciable fixed assets are adjusted to the cost of the respective assets and depreciated over the remaining useful life of such assets. Machinery spares which can be used only in connection with an item of fixed asset and whose use is expected to be irregular are capitalised and depreciated over the useful life of the principal item of the relevant assets. Subsequent expenditure relating to fixed assets is capitalised only if such expenditure results in an increase in the future benefits from such asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance. Fixed assets acquired and put to use for project purpose are capitalised and depreciation thereon is included in the project cost till commissioning of the project

Fixed assets acquired in full or part exchange for another asset are recorded at the fair market value or the net book value of the asset given up, adjusted for any balancing cash consideration. Fair market value is determined either for the assets acquired or asset given up, whichever is more clearly evident. Fixed assets acquired in exchange for securities of the Company are recorded at the fair market value of the assets or the fair market value of the securities issued, whichever is more clearly evident.

Fixed assets retired from active use and held for sale are stated at the lower of their net book value and net realisable value and are disclosed separately in the Balance Sheet.

2.10 Foreign currency transactions and translations

Initial recognition

Transactions in foreign currencies entered into by the Company and its integral foreign operations are accounted at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction or at rates that closely approximate the rate at the date of the transaction.

Measurement of foreign currency monetary items at the Balance Sheet date

Foreign currency monetary items (other than derivative contracts) of the Company and its net investment in non-integral foreign operations outstanding at the Balance Sheet date are restated at the year-end rates.

Treatment of exchange differences

Exchange differences arising on settlement / restatement of short-term foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities of the Company and its integral foreign operations are recognised as income or expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss. The exchange differences on restatement / settlement of loans to non-integral foreign operations that are considered as net investment in such operations are accumulated in a "Foreign currency translation reserve" until disposal / recovery of the net investment.

The exchange differences arising on restatement / settlement of long-term foreign currency monetary items are capitalised as part of the depreciable fixed assets to which the monetary item relates and depreciated over the remaining useful life of such assets or amortised on settlement / over the maturity period of such items if such items do not relate to acquisition of depreciable fixed assets. The unamortised balance is carried in the Balance Sheet as "Foreign currency monetary item translation difference account" net of the tax effect thereon.

2.11 Investments

Long-term investments (excluding investment properties), are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary, in the value of such investments. Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost and fair value. Cost of investments include acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

Investment properties are carried individually at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. Investment properties are capitalised and depreciated (where applicable) in accordance with the policy stated for Tangible Fixed Assets. Impairment of investment property is determined in accordance with the policy stated for Impairment of Assets.

2.12 Employee benefits

The Company does not have any 'Employee benefits like provident fund, superannuation fund, gratuity fund, compensated absences, long service awards and post-employment medical benefits.







2.13 Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs include interest, amortisation of ancillary costs incurred and exchange differences arising from foreign currency borrowings to the extent they are regarded as an adjustment to the interest cost. Costs in connection with the borrowing of funds to the extent not directly related to the acquisition of qualifying assets are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the loan. Borrowing costs, allocated to and utilised for qualifying assets, pertaining to the period from commencement of activities relating to construction / development of the qualifying asset upto the date of capitalisation of such asset is added to the cost of the assets. Capitalisation of borrowing costs is suspended and charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss during extended periods when active development activity on the qualifying assets is interrupted.

2.14 Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

2.15 Taxes on income

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) paid in accordance with the tax laws, which gives future economic benefits in the form of adjustment to future income tax liability, is considered as an asset if there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal income tax. Accordingly, MAT is recognised as an asset in the Balance Sheet when it is probable that future economic benefit associated with it will flow to the Company.

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets in respect of unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses are recognised only if there is virtual certainty that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realise such assets. Deferred tax assets are recognised for timing differences of other items only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which these can be realised. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date for their realisability.

2.16 Provisions and contingencies

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the Notes.

2.17 Goods & Services tax input credit

Goods & Services tax input credit is accounted for in the books in the period in which the underlying service received is accounted and when there is no uncertainty in availing / utilising the credits.
